You are invited to bring your class to Heritage Days at Sacajawea State Park. A wide variety of presenters have been lined up to expose your class to history of the 19th and early 20th century. Each class will be assigned to 4 stations, so plan for 2 hours. Each presentation will last 20-25 minutes with a 5-minute passing time. Teachers please list your top 6 choice. If you can stay after 1pm there is the possibility of visiting extra stations that have no one scheduled. From 9:30-12:30 the stations will all be full, except for giving the presenters a much-needed break.

Presentations start at 9am and run through 4pm. Be sure to figure how long it will take you to get to park and when you need to leave so that you won't have to miss a station. **PRIVATE SCHOOLS** are encouraged to come at 11am and stay longer. **HOMESCHOOLERS** are encouraged to come in the afternoon when they can go to more stations and not have to deal with the crowd.

Heritage Days is a **FREE EVENT!** However, entry into the park requires a Washington State Parks **DISCOVER PASS** (\$30) or a **DAY PASS** (\$10). Car pool if you can as the pass covers everyone in the car. If you have parents who are meeting your class at the park be sure they know. Please bring cash or check only.

You will be given a map, so you can orientate yourself to the sites when we confirm the times. Your schedule of 4 classes will be given to you as you get off bus or at the main information booth for non-bus riders. When you arrive, a guide will take you to your first class and explain where the next ones are. We will have several information booths to help you along the way.
